Medications to Avoid Before Procedures

Any injection, including Botox®, dermal fillers and local anesthetics, can cause significant bruising if you are on blood thinners. Surgery can cause additional bruising, which will slow your healing and promote swelling.

Do **NOT** take any of the following for **two weeks prior** to your injection and/or surgery:

Aspirin and aspirin-containing medications (Tylenol is acceptable)

Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) include:

Advil Ibuprofen Naproxin
Aleve Mediprin Nuprin
Bextra Motrin Vioxx

Celebrex

Herbal supplements and vitamins that thin the blood:

Airborne Red Clover Vitamin C (>40 IU)

Vitamin E (>40 IU) Echinacea Fish oil (Omega 3)

Flax Seed Garlic supplements Gingko Biloba

Ginseng Turmeric

Please let Dr. Cockerham know if you are on a potent blood thinner like <u>Coumadin (warfarin) or Plavix</u>; a special medical clearance will be required to stop these medications three days prior to injection or surgery.
